City Budget

FY2020 Summary Info

- Estimated revenues \$406.2 mill
- Projected deficit: \$18.8 mill

- Exempting police & fire – depts. face ave 14% reduction

- General Funds: FY2020 - \$403.6
- General Capital: FY2019 - \$85.4

City Budget Breakdown

Operating and Capital Budget Comparison

Operating

- Day-to-day delivery of City Services
- Paying employees
- Covering the cost of supplies needed to offer services
- Cannot be financed with resources from the sale of permanent improvements

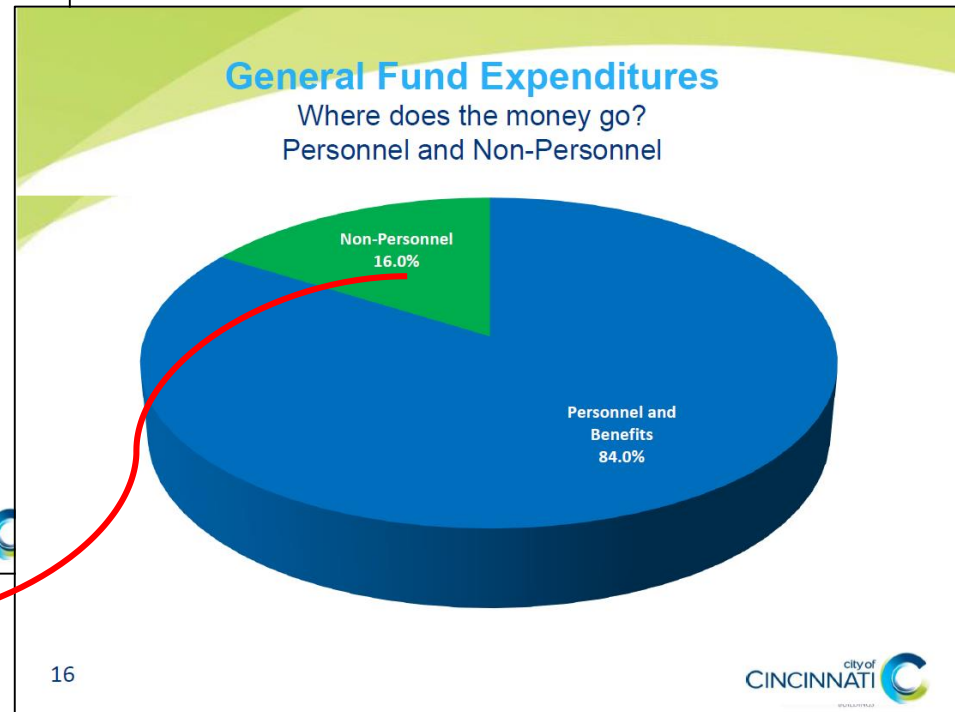
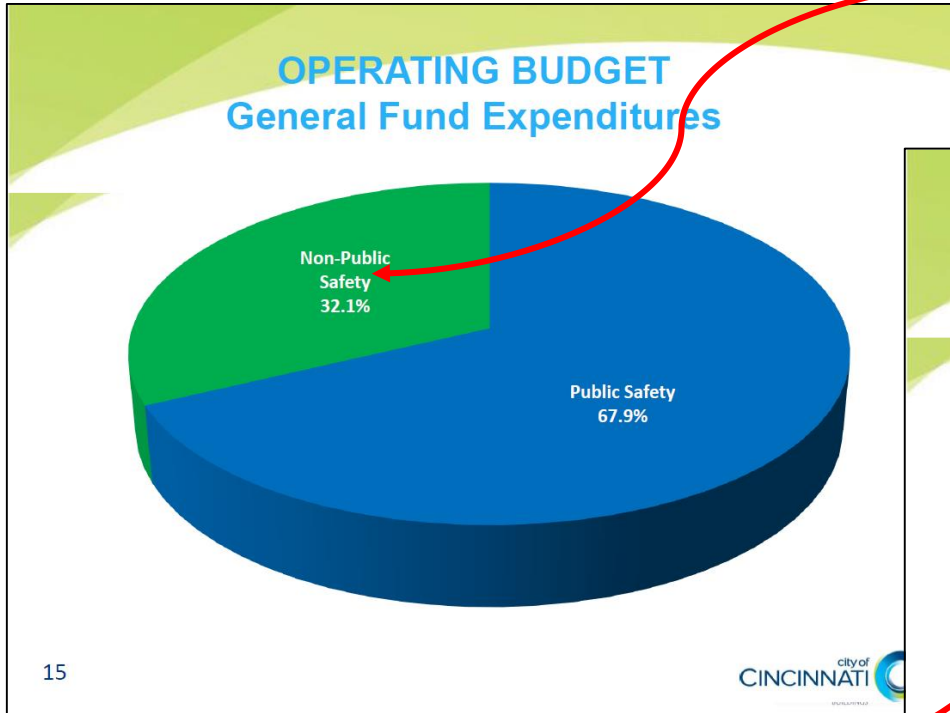
Capital

- Improvement, construction, or purchase of City assets
- Minimum \$5,000 cost and 5 year useful life
- Financed with combination of cash and debt resources

City Budget 2020

City Budget Breakdown: GF

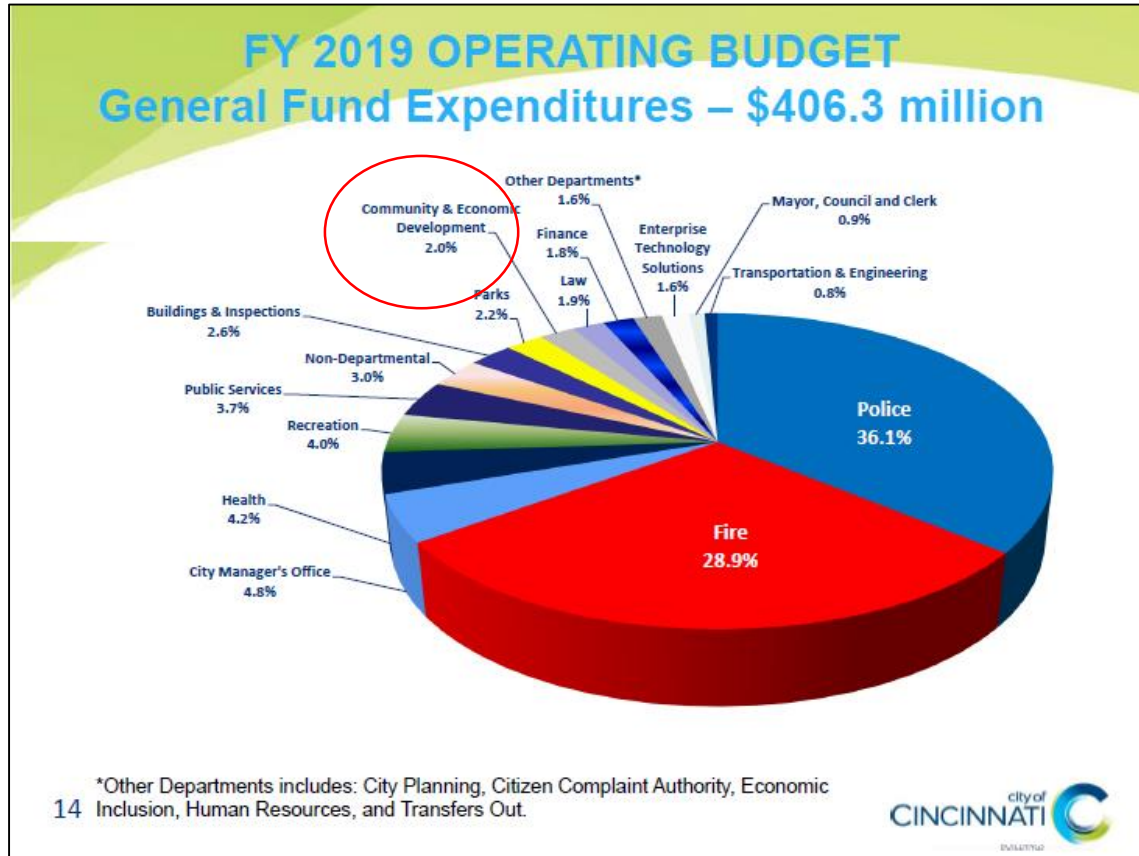
Of the FY2020 Operating Budget of \$406.3 mill, only 32.1% is non-public safety



Of that 32.1%, only 16% is non personnel & benefits

City Budget 2020

City Budget Breakdown: GF



EXAMPLE

DCED 2%= 8.1 mill
(NSP, NBD etc are in DCED)

- Before personnel costs – so \$6.8 mill spread over economic and real estate development, housing and neighborhood support (non-capital)

City Budget 2020

City Budget City Council Priorities FY2020 (in order)

- Police, Fire, Emergency
- ‘the basic and cores services’
- Non layoff of personnel
- 1.2% increase human services (including affordable housing trust fund and eviction prevention)
- Pedestrian safety & affordable housing priority consideration
- To the extent feasible, the budget should maintain funding for outside development partners who use City funds to leverage matching funds and additional investments from both public and private partnerships
- **To the extent feasible, the budget should maintain support for neighborhood groups, including neighborhood Community Councils and Neighborhood Business Districts**
- Building a fund balance of 16.7%

City Budget 2020

NSP 2020

History: from CBDG funds (Fed+Ham Co)

(No longer CBDG, now General Funds)

- Annual payments per council started at \$10,000
- Steadily decreased overall

FY2019 - \$6,085 + insurance (\$340,429)

FY2018 - \$6,800 (\$353,600)

FY2017 - \$7,700

FY2016 - \$6,800

Low point -2013 \$2,500

High point – 2004/5 - \$12,500

Engagement contract with City Manager's office

(this covers the ED – return to full year support: last yr 3 qtrs. \$37,500)

- 1) \$30,000 to cover Insurance premium & additional \$5k to manage it

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
